# Fees & Tuition Rates

### REGISTRATION FEES

**\$30** — if registered <u>and paid before/on</u> April 1, 2024

\$60 - if registered and paid before/on June 1, 2024

\$90 - if registered and paid after June 1, 2024

**Registration fees** help with startup costs that come with transitioning from one school year to another as paperwork is filed for new students. Additionally, decorations, name tags, hooks, and other supplies are prepared for each student among other duties for getting the classrooms ready in August. Due to the necessity of these funds to help with preparation for a new school year, your child's enrollment is not confirmed until the registration fee is paid. Please note these fees are non-refundable.

### TUITION PAYMENTS

Tuition for the 2024-2025 school year is \$160/month per student.

Tuition may also be paid in full (\$1440 for the year) or per semester (\$720/semester)

Tuition payments are **due on the 1st of each month,** beginning in September and continuing through May for a total of 9 payments.

### FINANCIAL AID / TUITION DISCOUNTS

Kiddie Kampus is pleased to offer financial assistance to qualifying families based on household income and other extenuating circumstances affecting family finances. A limited amount of money for Kiddie Kampus Financial Aid is made available through private donations. These funds are awarded on a first come, first serve basis; availability of funding; and submission of a complete and accurate application.

Due Date	Scholarship applications must be received by <b>July 31, 2024</b> to be considered in first round of awarding funds (Committee meets in August)
Selection Process	Applications will be reviewed by the Kiddie Kampus Advisory Committee. This committee will use the table below, based on Federal Poverty Guidelines, for determining financial aid based on Annual Household Income and Household Size. Expectations	Students receiving financial aid are expected to attend school on a regular basis. <b>Excessive absences</b> may result in the loss of money.
Confidentiality	Names of students on financial aid and the amount of money awarded will be confidential, released only to the parents of the children and office administrative staff.
